# GEORGE FLOYD UPDATE

## **Judge orders single trial for 4 former officers in George Floyd's death, keeps trial in Hennepin County**

That trial is now scheduled to begin on March 8, 2021.

Judge Cahill ruled that cameras will be allowed in the courtroom, citing the difficulties presented by COVID-19 and the need for social distancing. Because courtroom access and seating will be limited, Judge Cahill said cameras are needed to present a trial that is truly public. He did include a list of limitations in his ruling. Among them:

- Jurors can't be shown
- No witness under age 18 can be shown on video (but can use audio)
- No members of George Floyd's family appearing on video unless consenting
- No zooming on tables of lawyers or defendant
- No microphones on counsel tables

# DEATH BY COCK

## **Police officer killed by rooster while breaking up cockfight**

A police officer has been killed by a rooster while attempting to break up an illegal cockfight in the Philippines, authorities have said.

Police in the Northern Samar province said Lieutenant Christian Bolok was struck by the rooster's gaff -- a metal blade attached to the bird for a fight.

The gaff hit Bolok's femoral artery as he was confiscating the bird, police said, adding: "He was rushed to the provincial hospital but was pronounced dead on arrival due to heavy blood loss."

There is a long history of both legal and illegal cockfighting in the Philippines, but the sport was banned in the region in August after it was found to have been a source of Covid-19 infections.

Illegal cockfights in the country are known as "tupada" and often operate in underground locations to avoid detection by authorities.

"I have a heavy heart as we have lost a brother who sacrificed his own life in the name of service," Northern Samar police provincial director Arnel Apud said in a statement sent to the government-run Philippines News Agency. "The (Philippine National Police) grieves the untimely death of Lt. Bolok and extends its deepest sympathy to his family and relatives."

Three people were arrested at the event and three more suspects were identified but remain at large after escaping the raid, the Philippines News Agency reported.

Officers confiscated seven fighting cocks and recovered 550 pesos (\$11).

Bolok's police force posted images from a memorial service held for the officer on Wednesday.

# LLOYD'S OF LONDON

## London's Centuries-Old Insurance Market Investigates Its Slavery Role

Lloyd's of London launches an internal investigation in response to pressure from Black employees and racial-equality campaigners

Lloyd's of London has launched an internal investigation into its role in the trans-Atlantic slave trade in part to determine whether it is on the hook to pay reparations.

The 332-year-old insurance market is responding to pressure from Black employees and racial-equality campaigners to open up about the slave trade in the 18th and 19th centuries. Lloyd's Chairman Bruce Carnegie-Brown said he is talking to academic and cultural institutions that can help to investigate its archive.

"We insured cargo vessels and slaves that were the cargoes of those vessels going across the Atlantic to the Caribbean and the East Coast of the United States," Mr. Carnegie-Brown said. "It's almost certain that we have a very high share of whatever insurance was bought. We don't know today how much insurance was bought."

Amid a global reckoning on race sparked by the May killing of George Floyd by a police officer in Minneapolis, pressure increased on Lloyd's and other British companies to acknowledge their historic links to slavery and face the possibility of reparations.

Mr. Carnegie-Brown said Lloyd's risk of reparations was unclear because the company is comparable to a stock market "that just convenes the buying and selling of insurance by other entities." In the days of slavery, Lloyd's didn't underwrite insurance or have a central fund like today, he said. Lloyd's was unsuccessfully sued by descendants of slaves in the U.S. more than a decade ago.

Describing reparations as a "loaded word," Mr. Carnegie-Brown said there would be "legal issues to probe to try to get a better understanding about whether any kind of concept of Lloyd's existed in a way that would command some kind of challenge around reparations."

Mr. Carnegie-Brown said he was hesitant to get involved in conversations about reparations without being much better educated on the legal parameters.

"Dialogue with mutual respect and understanding is what we ask," Hilary Beckles, the chairman of a reparations commission representing Jamaica, Barbados and other Caribbean nations, said. "We need closure and to move on. We can put this terrible history behind us and get on with our business and our lives with the context of justice."

JPMorgan Chase & Co. this month committed \$30 billion—mainly in the form of new lending—to improve racial equality in the U.S. Lloyd's has pledged £1 million, equivalent to \$1.3 million, to

charities that assist Black people. Mr. Carnegie-Brown said the sum “almost certainly” wasn’t enough but was a start.

“We certainly don’t have \$30 billion so it’s never going to get to that number,” he said.

# RED PILL

## **There's a 50-50 Chance We Really Are Living in a Simulation, Scientists Say**

Some scientists believe that there's a 50-50 chance we really are living in a simulation, and now we have to wonder if *The Matrix* is looking more like a documentary than science fiction.

In a report from *Popular Mechanics* (via *Scientific American*), some scientists believe that the odds that life as we know it is a simulation could be as simple as a coin toss. This 50-50 coin toss approximation comes from the *Scientific American*-cited odds of 50.22222 to 49.77778 when determining whether or not life is a simulation. *Scientific American*, and subsequently *Popular Mechanics*, cite philosopher Nick Bostrom's 2003 paper, "Are We Living in a Computer Simulation?" to explain where odds like the ones above come from.

"I argue that at least one of the following propositions is true," Bostrom says in his paper. "(1): the human species is very likely to become extinct before reaching 'posthuman' stage; (2): any posthuman civilization is extremely unlikely to run a significant number of simulations of its evolutionary history (or variations thereof); (3): we are almost certainly living in a computer simulation. It follows that the belief that there is a significant chance that we shall one day become posthumans who run ancestor-simulations is false, unless we are currently living in a simulation."

Bostrom's simulation theory focuses on computing power, much like *The Matrix* and its sequels did when discussing the idea of humankind simulation. It might be hard to believe there exists a computer powerful enough to simulate our entire existence but, if such a computer did exist, we would never be able to recognize it to begin with as we'd be inside of it, or rather, a part of its simulation.

Bostrom's theory of simulation sees the odds at nearly 50-50 and Columbia University astronomer David Kipping used Bostrom's theory as a guide for arriving to his own odds. Kipping's theory dictates that simulations cannot spawn their own additional simulations.

"That is because as simulations spawn more simulations, the computer resources available to each subsequent generation dwindle to the point where the vast majority of realities will be those that do not have the computing power necessary to simulate offspring realities that are capable of hosting conscious beings."

As *Popular Mechanics* points out, think of Russian nesting dolls. Each subsequent doll after the first doll must fit into the doll that came before it. As a result, each doll grows smaller and smaller in size and scale as you go deeper into the nest of dolls.

Basically, we are either in a simulation or we are not in a simulation. If humankind never creates its own simulation using conscious beings, then the odds of us living in a simulation tip further toward "yes," because if we are in a simulation, then we likely wouldn't be able to create one. If humankind does create a simulation of its own using conscious beings, then Kipping and Bostrom's theory about computing power are closer to being proven wrong and the odds of us living in a simulation shift more towards "no."

## **Polyamorous Florida woman with 4 boyfriends is pregnant**

A polyamorous woman in Florida with four partners is pregnant, and says despite sharing her bed with her many lovers, she's certain of who the father is.

Tory Ojeda, 20, lives with three of her four partners in their Jacksonville, Fla., home. Marc, Travis, Ethan and Christopher take turns spending time with Ojeda, "swapping in and out" of her bed each night, she tells Barcroft Media.

The household's love story began three years ago when Ojeda met Marc, 18, in high school. Two months later, she opened things up with Travis, 23 — to whom she is now engaged. Later, she brought Ethan, 22, and Christopher, 22, into the fold.
